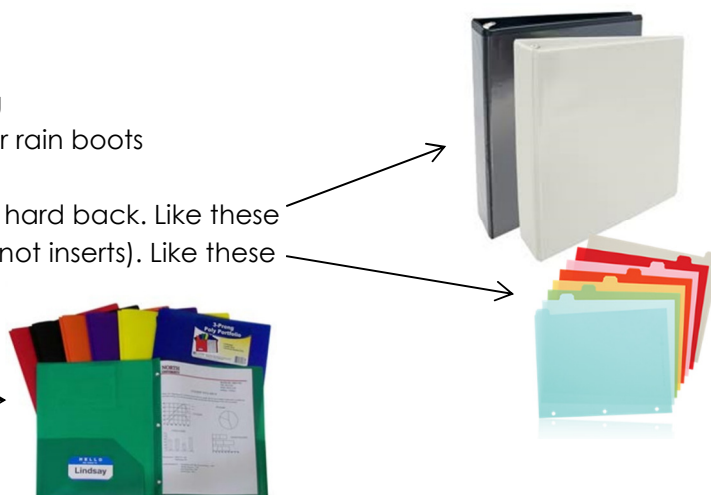


Seven Generations Charter School Student Supplies List – Grade 4 – Mrs. Reeves & Mrs. Dimotsis

Note: Seven Gen uses the Responsive Classroom program in all classrooms. This is used to create a strong sense of community. Many of our consumable materials (e.g. pencils, paper) will be stored and used collectively as a classroom. Therefore, we ask that you **do not label** consumable community materials (as indicated below).

Personal Materials (Please label!):

- Reusable lunch container
- Ear Phones or Ear Buds – labeled in a ziplock bag
- (1) raincoat with hood, (1) pair rain pants, (1) pair rain boots
- (1) reusable water bottle (labeled)
- (1) ½ " 3-ring binder – pocket window view front, hard back. Like these
- (1) package of 8 tab separators – *write-on tabs* (not inserts). Like these
- (2) 100-sheet composition notebooks
- (1) pocket folders – HOLE PUNCHED
- (1) 1" 3-ring binder – hard back
- (3) 3 GREEN 3-Prong Folders. Like these



Community Materials (Do not label):

- 1 box of Dixon Ticonderoga #2 Pencils (pre-sharpened preferred)
- **GIRLS:** 1 box of crayons **BOYS:** 1 box of markers
- **GIRLS:** 1 box of colored pencils **BOYS:** Black Sharpies
- 1 pack of Expo dry erase markers
- 1 pair of scissors
- 1 roll of paper towels
- 1 bottle of hand sanitizer
- 1 container of disinfectant wipes
- 2 boxes of tissues
- 2 packs of hole-punched loose-leaf lined notebook paper
- **GIRLS:** 1 package of post-it notes **BOYS:** 1 roll of clear packing tape
- **GIRLS:** 1 package of mixed-color construction paper **BOYS:** 1 package of rolls of scotch tape
- 1 package of hand-held erasers (NOT pencil-toppers!)

Lunch-Packing Tips:

At Seven Gen we try to generate the least amount of garbage possible. We use a “pack in and pack out” policy, which means that whatever comes in with lunch, leaves in the lunch box. We recommend the following lunch-packing tips to save money and reduce waste:

- Instead of juice boxes or pouches, purchase a small thermos with a tight-fitting lid, or ask your child to use his/her water bottle.
- Instead of packaged foods like Lunchables, purchase a sectioned container that can be filled with different foods. This can be washed and re-used daily.
- Instead of individual applesauces, puddings, etc., stock up on large jars and re-use containers.
- If you do pack items that will create waste, such as pouches of applesauce, pudding, or Dole fruit cups, send in a sandwich-sized ziplock bag for the waste. This way, the used item does not create a mess inside your child’s lunch box after they are finished with it.
