NOTE: Seven Generations will continue to use the “Responsive Classroom” program in all classrooms this year. Through Responsive Classroom principles, we work to establish a strong sense of community. Many of our consumable supplies will be stored and used collectively in our classrooms. Therefore, there is no need to label consumable school supplies such as markers, paper, and crayons. **Please label personal items with a permanent marker** as this makes for a better organized classroom!

Personal Items (To be labeled with your child’s name):

- Folders:
 - 3 Green (Investigations) – **These folders MUST be 3-prong folders!**
 - 1 Blue (Writing)
 - 1 Orange (Reading)
 - 1 Red (Math)
 - 1 Take-Home Folder – Any color – needs 3 holes to go in binder
- **1-inch** 3 ring binder with pockets
- 3 Composition books (labeled with name but not subject, please)
- 1 4-subject spiral notebook
- 1 pencil Box (Mr. Pellak and Mrs. Ramirez) **or** 1 pencil pouch (Mrs. Keim)
- 1 pack markers
- 1 pack crayons
- 1 pack colored pencils
- 1 pair of scissors
- Reusable lunch container and water bottle
- **Rain gear** (all gear must be labeled):
 - Raincoat with a hood
 - Rain pants
 - Rain boots

Community Supplies (Do not label):

- 6 Glue sticks (Elmer’s sticks best!)
- 36 Ticonderoga (#2) pencils
- 1 pack dry erase markers
- 5 GOOD erasers (NOT pencil toppers)
- 2 large boxes of tissues
- 1-2 Rolls of paper towels
- Last names A-M:
 - 1 pack of colored printer paper (NOT construction paper)
 - 1 container of disinfectant wipes
- Last names N-Z:
 - 1 pack of cardstock – any color or white
 - 1 bottle hand sanitizer

See anything on sale? We can always use: plain white printer paper, extra tissues, extra pencils, paper clips, black and colorful sharpies, rubber bands, laminating pouches (size 8.5 x 11), magic erasers, extra pink erasers, Pet store gift cards for class pet supplies

Lunch Packing Tips:

At Seven Gen, we try to generate the least amount of garbage possible. We use a “pack in and pack out” policy which means that whatever comes in with lunch must go back home in the lunch box.

We recommend the following lunch packing tips to save money and reduce waste:

- Instead of juice boxes or pouches, purchase small thermos with a tight fitting lid or have your child use his or her water bottle.
- Instead of packaged foods like Lunchables, purchase a sectioned container that can be filled with different foods. This can be washed and reused daily.
- Instead of individual applesauce, pudding, etc., stock up on larger jars and use reusable containers to portion foods.
- If you do pack items that will create waste, please send a sandwich sized zip-lock bag so that used food items do not create a mess inside your child’s lunch box when they are finished.
