Note: Seven Generations will continue to use the “Responsive Classroom” program in all classrooms this year. Through Responsive Classroom principles, we work to establish a strong sense of community. Many of our consumable supplies will be stored and used collectively in our classrooms. Therefore, there is no need to label consumable school supplies such as makers, paper, and crayons. **Please label personal items** as this makes for a better, more organized classroom!

Personal Items Labeled with your Child’s Name:

- **5 Folders** (all with pockets): *Investigations*: 1 green, *Literacy*: 1 blue, *Math*: 1 red, *In Progress*: 1 yellow, *Take Home*: 1 of your choice
- **5** 100-sheet composition notebooks
- 1 pair of rain boots
- 1 rain jacket with hood (If it is not designed to roll up into a reversible zipper pocket, please roll up and place in a zip- lock bag with your child’s name on the bag and on the jacket.)
- 1 pair rain pants (optional – in labeled zip-lock bag)
- 1 reusable water bottle
- Durable Lunchbox
- Backpack for school and hiking (ideally, a fitted backpack with two straps that a student can use for hikes as well as for carrying materials/books to and from school)
- 1 1-inch 3-ring binder (for portfolio, will stay at school)
- 1 pack, 8 plastic 3-ring pocket dividers (dividers with pockets are very helpful)

Community Supplies (Do not label)

- 1 pack of loose-leaf, lined notebook paper
- 1 pack of post-it notes (any size)
- 2 - 36 #2 pencils (sharpened)
- 1 pack markers, fine tip and regular
- 1 pack colored pencils
- 1 pack of Low-VOC dry erase markers and dry erase eraser
- 1 roll of clear tape (like Scotch tape)
- 1 pack glue sticks
- Box of Tissues (these go quick)
- 1 pack sharpies (boys)
- 1 pack 12 x 12 scrapbook paper (girls)
- 1 roll of masking tape (girls)
- 1 box of crayons

- Paint brushes, Pipe cleaners, Disinfectant wipes, Sharpies, Acrylic paints, pencils and TISSUES! We went through 15 boxes before winter break. 😊

Lunch Packing Tips:

At Seven Gen, we try to generate the least amount of garbage possible. We use a “pack in and pack out” policy, which means that whatever comes in with lunch, goes back home in the lunch box.

We recommend the following lunch packing tips to save money and reduce waste:

Instead of juice boxes or pouches, purchase a small thermos with a tight-fitting lid, or ask your child to use his/her water bottle.

Instead of packaged foods like Lunchables, purchase a sectioned container that can be filled with different foods. This can be washed and reused daily.

Instead of individual applesauce, pudding, etc., stock up on large jars and re-use containers.

If you do pack items that will create waste, such as pouches of applesauce, pudding, or Dole fruit cups, send in a sandwich sized ziplock bag for the waste. This way, the used item does not create a mess inside your child’s lunch box after they are finished with it.
